

Hello everyone, and welcome to lesson #2 for our BuildAbility world. We're going to learn how to download Minecraft; Education Edition. Dan, my friend, has everything for us. We're going to turn it over to Dan to show us how to do that.

There's a quick link, but I'm going to just type into a Google Search, "Minecraft Education Edition." Hit enter and there' is the official site. It's the first one that comes up. The link is on the banner below.

When we get to the Minecraft Education Edition official website, to download Minecraft, we have to click on "Download" right up near the top right of the screen.

Here are all the links to get started.

I'm on a Windows device, so it's recommending for me, this download here. However, you can scroll down here and you can see all the other available platforms at the bottom.

If you have a Chromebook, it takes us to the Google Play Store. If you have a Mac, it actually downloads the Mac installer. If you have an iPad, it will take you to the Apple Store.

You can get to all of the respective downloads that you're going to need for the various platforms. Now, you may not be able to download Minecraft if you're running a school-managed device. It may have certain protections on it. If s, you may have to approach your IT department and inquire about getting the access to either install it or having them install it for you.

That's nice and simple! The great thing about this is that it works on pretty much all platforms. Whatever device you have, the website actually recognizes it! Do talk to your IT department if you have any trouble.

Go to education.minecraft.net and then click "Download."
